

### Scholastic Leveled Reading Program

In order to offer extra opportunities to read books at home with Mom and Dad, we will be starting our leveled Scholastic Reading Program in September. In order to help us more effectively organize which level students should start reading at, we need YOU, the parents, to help us with the process and to give you more input in where your child will start their supplemental reading program at TKS.

There are several levels, but we want to know where your child is most comfortable at in terms of both reading speed and comprehension. It is important to start at a level where your child can read and enjoy the level they start at. Since there are limited books in each level, if they start too high they may not enjoy reading time at home and we want that special time to be as enjoyable as possible to form a lifelong love of reading.

Most students will start at level C or D. Don't worry if your child starts below these levels, as they can move up at their own pace once we have started.

We would like you to take time to have your child read at least 3 levels. For example: If your child thinks they are level D, they should read a level C, level D and level E book on the website. We would like you to please video your child reading their chosen level and then submit it to Class Dojo for us to review.

It is important that your child not practice the books. They need to read three books, one time, with you listening.
